Heidelberg Catechism Q. and A. 74

Pastor:

Q. Should infants also be baptized?

Congregation:

A. Yes.

Infants as well as adults

are included in God's covenant and people, and they, no less than adults, are promised deliverance from sin through Christ's blood and the Holy Spirit who produces faith.

Therefore, by baptism, the sign of the covenant, they too should be incorporated into the Christian church and distinguished from the children of unbelievers.

This was done in the Old Testament by circumcision, which was replaced in the New Testament by baptism.

Apostle's Creed

I believe in God the Father, Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified dead, and buried; He descended in to Hell; The third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit.

I believe a holy catholic Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

Baptism of Brinley Margaret Alsum

The Vows

(Minister addresses the parents)

Since you have presented this child for holy baptism, you are asked to answer the following questions before God and His people:

First, do you confess Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, accept the promises of God, and affirm the truth of the Christian faith which is proclaimed in the Bible and confessed in this church of Christ?

Second, do you believe that your child, though sinful by nature, is received by God in Christ as a member of his covenant, and therefore ought to be baptized?

Third, do you promise, in reliance on the Holy Spirit and with the help of the Christian community, to do all in your power to instruct this child in the Christian faith and to lead Him by your example to be Christ's disciple?

(The parents respond): **We do, God helping us.**

(The minister addresses the congregation)

Do you, the people of the Lord, promise to receive this child in love, pray for her, help instruct her in faith, and encourage and sustain her in the fellowship of believers?

(The congregation responds): **We do, God helping us.**

The Sacrament

Our Lord said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." Mark 10:14

(In administering the sacrament, the minister shall say):

Brinley Margaret Alsum, I baptize you into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
